### 26th Sunday in Ordinary Time September 29, 2024

The readings for the 26th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year B remind us not to exclude or hinder others doing God's work. They highlight instances where individuals outside the chosen group receive the Spirit and perform miracles, teaching us to avoid pride and embrace the broader community of believers.

### Social Justice Reflection - September 2024 The Difference Between Charity and Justice

While charity and justice are constitutive elements of the Gospel, prompting and inspiring our actions to do God's Will on earth, they form two distinct and essential aspects of our call as disciples of Christ. The office of Social Justice, Archdiocese of St. Paul/ Minneapolis, presents the following chart to illustrate the distinction.

Charity	Justice
Charity = social service. Charity provides direct services like food, clothing, shelter	Justice = social change. Justice promotes social change in institutions or political structures
Responds to immediate needs.	Responds to long-term needs.
Directed at the <i>effects</i> of injustice, its symptoms. Charity addresses existing problems.	Directed at the <i>root causes</i> of social problems. Justice addresses the <i>underlying structures</i> or <i>causes</i> of these problems.
Charity is private, individual acts	Justice is public, collective actions.
Examples of charity: homeless shelters, food banks, clothing drives, emergency services.	Examples of justice: legislative advocacy, changing policies and practices, political action.

Historically, we have been very good at doing charity. Doing justice is more challenging because the results are not immediately evident. The following quote calls us to follow Jesus' example to **be in** the world and **not of** the world:

Catholic teaching calls us to serve those in need <u>and</u> to change the structures that deny people their dignity and rights as children of God. Service <u>and</u> action, charity <u>and</u> justice are complementary components of parish social ministry. Neither alone is sufficient; <u>both</u> are essential signs of the gospel at work. A parish serious about social ministry will offer opportunities to serve those in need <u>and</u> to advocate for justice and peace. These are not competing priorities, but two dimensions of the same fundamental mission to protect the life and dignity of the human person.
