First Reading – [1 Kings 17:10-16](#): Elijah asked a widow for water and bread. She had little but obeyed him. God provided enough flour and oil for them to eat for a year.

Responsorial Psalm – [Psalm 146](#): The Lord is faithful, just, and caring. He provides for the needy, frees captives, and protects the vulnerable. He will reign forever.

Second Reading – [Hebrews 9:24-28](#): Christ entered heaven, not a man-made sanctuary, and sacrificed himself once to remove sin. He will return to bring salvation to those who wait for him.

World Day of the Poor

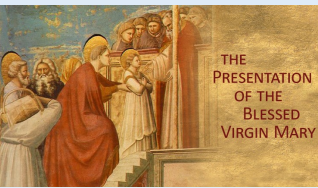
November 17

Theme: The prayer of the poor rises up to God
(*Sirach 21.5*)

In his message for World Day of the Poor 2024, Pope Francis says,

God knows the sufferings of his children because he is an attentive and caring father. As a father, he takes care of those who are most in need: the poor, the marginalized, the suffering and the forgotten. No one is excluded from his heart, for in his eyes, we are all poor and needy.

God, help us to open our hearts and eyes to see and respond with kindness and mercy to the poor we encounter daily.



The Memorial of the Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary in the Temple (November 21) recalls the day on which Mary, while still a child, was brought to the temple in Jerusalem to be offered to God. “Blessed are those who hear the Word of God and observe it” (Lk. 11:28). This experience prepared the young girl from Nazareth to become the “temple of the Son of God”.

The celebration of this feast dates back to the 6th century in the East with the dedication of the Basilica of Saint Mary the New built by the Emperor Justinian I near the ruins of the temple in Jerusalem. There is evidence that various monasteries in Italy celebrated the feast in the 9th century. It was not until the 15th century that it was included in the Roman Missal.

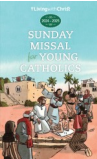
